I did have to take some shots to stimulate bone marrow growth which did create some aches and pains but did not stop me from going to concerts and walking up and down the city.

The day of donation I went to the donation center and was given the last of the shots needed for the procedure. I would barely call it a procedure it was more like a prolonged blood draw in both arms. All I had to do was sit there and watch TV.
