

## **Subject: Request for Proposals - Kummer Institute's IGSET (Ignition Grants for Sustainable Educational Transformation) Internal Grants**

Administered by the Office of Online Learning and Educational Innovation, the FY2026 IGSET program can provide departments or faculty teams with up to \$80,000 to develop **templates for asynchronous online courses** that will expand modality options for the university's catalog of high-quality, deliberately designed programs. The flexibility of asynchronous programs expands S&T's reach to new audiences, including working professionals and adult learners, and can be a strong draw for regional, national, and even international students who seek the prestige of an S&T degree but lack the ability to relocate.

A total of \$205,000 is available in this round of funding.

### **Funding Priorities**

- Priority will be given to proposals for **complete programs** in areas with strong enrollment potential.
- Priority will be given to **graduate programs**.
- Courses are expected to launch in **Fall 2026** or **Spring 2027**.
- All courses will follow a **templated design** for consistent quality and adaptability across multiple audiences.

### **Course Development Process**

- Faculty subject-matter experts will be partnered with instructional designers in the Office of Online Learning and Educational Innovation.
- The course design process prioritizes the creation of digital experiences that encourage high levels of instructor and student engagement.
- Faculty developers will be primarily responsible for providing content for these courses, and no advanced technical skills or instructional design knowledge is required.

### **Proposal Submission Guidelines**

Proposals should include the following:

- A description of the program, including the potential benefits of asynchronous delivery for enrollment growth (maximum 1500 words);
- A preliminary production timeline for the program;
- A brief biography (1-2 paragraphs) highlighting relevant teaching or professional experience for each member of the team;
- A support letter from the Department Chair or Dean explaining the project's importance to departmental or college goals;
- A budget for the project that includes compensation for faculty developers (about \$8000 per course). Ideally, funds should be spent by June 30, 2026.

### **Additional Information**

- All instructors of online courses must be certified through the [Missouri S&T Online Teaching Certification course](#).

- All courses must successfully complete the Quality Course Review process.
- Faculty developers will submit a signed IP agreement for asynchronous courses.

## **Evaluation Criteria**

Each proposal will be evaluated by a committee of institutional stakeholders using the following weighted criteria:

- **Strategic Alignment (25%)**
  - Relevance to Missouri S&T's enrollment, retention, and strategic growth goals.
  - Contribution to expanding the catalog of high-demand online programs.
  - Consideration of working professionals, adult learners, and other priority audiences.
- **Enrollment Potential and Impact (20%)**
  - Evidence of strong enrollment demand for the proposed course(s) or program.
  - Potential to scale across multiple audiences.
  - Anticipated long-term sustainability and contribution to institutional growth.
- **Quality of Proposal and Clarity of Vision (20%)**
  - Clear articulation of program goals, outcomes, and assessment strategies.
  - Thoughtful vision for asynchronous delivery, demonstrating understanding of digital engagement.
  - Coherence and persuasiveness of the proposal narrative.
- **Feasibility & Timeline (15%)**
  - Realistic production schedule and development milestones.
  - Demonstrated ability of the faculty team to meet deadlines.
  - Appropriateness of proposed budget for student workers or additional expenses.
- **Faculty Expertise and Commitment (10%)**
  - Relevant subject-matter expertise and teaching experience.
  - Evidence of readiness to collaborate with instructional designers.
  - Strong commitment from faculty developers to course completion.
- **Departmental/Dean Endorsement (10%)**
  - Strength and specificity of the Department Chair's or Dean's support letter.
  - Alignment with departmental or college-level goals.

## **Submission Deadline**

Priority deadline for proposals is September 29, 2025. Reviews will begin on October 1, 2025, and will continue until all funds are assigned.
